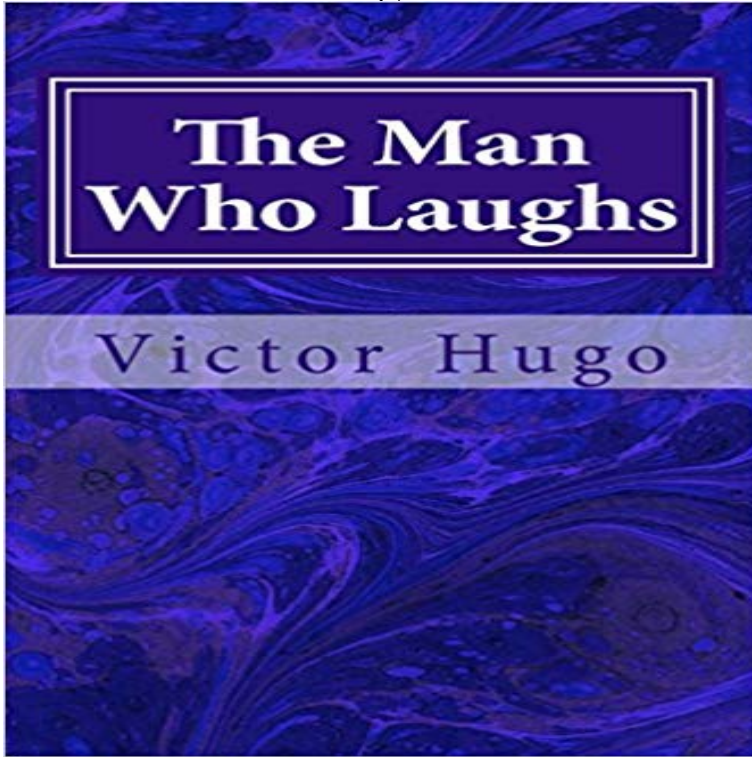


# The Man Who Laughs
